

**RESOLUTION NO. 12-157
CITY OF LIBERTY LAKE
SPOKANE COUNTY, WASHINGTON**

**A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSAL OF A CERTAIN VEHICLE
DEEMED TO BE SURPLUS AND NO LONGER USED BY THE CITY OF LIBERTY
LAKE, WASHINGTON**

WHEREAS, a certain police vehicle belonging to the City of Liberty Lake is no longer needed by the City; and


WHEREAS, the value and condition of this vehicle makes it impractical to trade the same on future purchases of a new vehicle, and to obtain the maximum return for said vehicle, it should be in the best interest of the City to dispose of the vehicle listed in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the City believes that it is in the best public interest to transfer this vehicle to a neighboring jurisdiction, to provide speed control within the jurisdiction limits and whereas this jurisdiction does not have adequate funding to provide its own vehicle;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Liberty Lake, Washington, as follows:

The vehicle belonging to the City of Liberty Lake as shown in Exhibit A is declared to be surplus to the foreseeable needs of the City and it is deemed to be for the common benefit of the residents of the City to dispose of said inventory. The Mayor is authorized to dispose of the items listed in this Resolution in a manner that will be to the best advantage of the City of Liberty Lake.



EXHIBIT A

Surplus Vehicle Fact Sheet

The above listed vehicle has been assigned to SCOPE (Sheriff's Community Oriented Policing Effort) since 2008. In 2011 and 2012 the vehicle has been used as a spare SCOPE vehicle due to the mechanical condition and high mileage on the vehicle. The vehicle has not been used as an assigned patrol vehicle for police department use since 2008.

Per RCW it is required that any police vehicles that are to be sold to the public, have all emergency equipment and decals removed from the vehicle. It is estimated that the cost to decommission the SCOPE vehicle would be \$500.00.

The NADA trade in value for the vehicle is estimated at \$650.00. The vehicle would require some substantial maintenance for it to be used as reliable daily transportation.

The Town of Rockford plans to use the vehicle as a crime/traffic deterrent by parking the vehicle throughout the community at strategic locations.

By providing the surplus vehicle to another jurisdiction, we are not required to remove the emergency equipment and markings from the patrol car.
