



NEXGEN OVERDRIVE STREAMLINES EBOOKS

Getting to our ebooks through the Washington Anytime Library just got easier!

OverDrive, the provider of downloadable e- and audiobooks to the Washington Anytime Library, upgraded us to their Next Generation site in March. This gives us a new way to enjoy ebooks and more from the library.

Some of the new features include:

- **One-step checkout:** just log in to your account with your library card information to borrow a book with one click!
- **OverDrive Read:** this browser-based reader enables instant access to most ebooks, online or offline, without needing to download or install an app or other software. Open up Safari, Google Chrome, IE, or Firefox on your computer or device to start reading

available books right away, and sync across devices! You can still download as usual to transfer to ereader devices like Kindle Paper White and Nook Simple Touch.

- **A new responsive design** optimizes the website for mobile and desktop use. Regardless of what device you use, the experience will be the same.
- **New navigation and search** features let you find your book fast and easy!
