

**The Uncommon Appeal of Clouds** Isabel Dalhousie, philosopher and amateur sleuth, returns to ponder life's questions and foil an art thief in Alexander McCall Smith's popular series.

**The 4-Hour Chef** Efficiency guru Timothy Ferriss uses cooking to demonstrate how you can master anything.

**The Boy Kings of Texas: a Memoir** Domingo Martinez conjures up his border-town upbringing in 1980s Texas in this National Book Award finalist.

**The World Until Yesterday** Physiologist and author (Guns, Germs, & Steel) Jared Diamond studies traditional societies to see what their solutions to human problems offer us today.
