

TIMELINE OF LIBRARY EVENTS IN LIBERTY LAKE 2001-2013

- Aug. 31, 2001:** City of Liberty Lake incorporated
- 2001:** Library started in Joy Peck's basement
Community Library Council formed
Greenstone Corp. donates library space
- 2002:** Negotiations to join Spok. Co. Lib. District
- Jan. 2003:** City Council proposes independent municipal library
- Oct. 2003:** Council passes ordinance to establish City Library
- Dec. 2003:** Pamela Mogen hired as library director
- Jan. 2004:** Community Library Council becomes Friends of Library group
- April 2006:** Friends group wins Wash. Lib. Assoc. Distinguished Service Award
- June 2006:** Library wins Assoc. of Wash. Cities Achiever of the Year Award
- April 2008:** Library/community center bond defeated at polls
- Oct. 2008:** City purchases building for library and police department on East Mission Ave.
- March 2009:** Library moves into new building
- July 2010:** Library Foundation forms
- April 2011:** 1st Foundation fundraiser begins
- Sept. 2011:** Library offers downloadable eBooks
- Oct. 2011:** Dir. Mogen receives WLA Merit Award
- Aug. 2012:** LLML joins Cooperative Information Network, adding access to 500K+ items
- Oct. 2012:** Shared borrowing agreement reached with SCLD, giving Liberty Lake residents free access to County libraries
- Nov. 2012:** Improvements to Library entrance begin—covered entry, automated doors
- April 2013:** Foundation completes tile mural fundraising project, "Community Spirit"
- June 2013:** Benches, bike racks, paint and sign complete entrance improvements

Day Hiking: Eastern Washington Spokesman-Review outdoor writer Rich Landers' guide to day hikes around the region in this popular recreation series.

Practical Paleo: a Customized Approach to Health and a Whole Foods Lifestyle The latest dieting trend promotes eating unprocessed, "ancestral" food in sensible portions.

She Left Me the Gun After her mother's death, journalist Emma Brockes dug into her mother's life, revealing a secretive, devastating past in South Africa that her mother's strength shielded her from.

The Bookman's Tale: a Novel of Obsession An antiquarian bookseller's quest to come to terms with his past leads him on a search for a mysterious woman in a picture and the true writer of Shakespeare's plays.

The Mermaid of Brooklyn When a young mother's gambling husband doesn't return home one night she makes a desperate decision, until some unexpected aquatic aid helps her turn her life around.

Revenge Wears Prada: the Devil Returns Sequel to the popular novel and movie revisits the characters 10 years on, established in their own media careers and facing the challenges of adulthood.

Django Unchained From the director of *Pulp Fiction* and *Inglourious Basterds* comes a colorful and violent homage to the great Western film tradition in the story of a freed slave and his struggle to rescue his wife.

Falling Skies Seasons one and two of this sci-fi drama follow the human resistance movement against alien invaders. Produced by Steven Spielberg.

Homeland A CIA agent suspects a long-MIA marine of being a terrorist double agent in this award-winning series.

Oz the Great and Powerful Director Sam Raimi (*Spider-man 1-3, Evil Dead*) helms this special effects ride back to Oz that tells the Wizard's story before he was the Wizard, and sets the stage for Dorothy's familiar journey.
