OneClickdigital, one of our downloadable audiobook providers, has recently expanded into **eBooks**, giving you a third option for digital reading material.

OCd's eBooks are in the EPUB format compatible with Nooks and non-Kindle eReaders, iPads, and tablets and phones running the Android and Windows operating systems, including Kindle Fire.

Tablet and smart phone users need to download the OneClickBook app from their app providers and authorize it with a free Adobe ID. PC and Mac users can download Adobe Digital Editions to read on their computers or transfer to an eReader.




