

OCd's eBooks are in the EPUB format compatible with Nooks and non-Kindle eReaders, iPads, and tablets and phones running the Android and Windows operating systems, including Kindle Fire.

Tablet and smart phone users need to download the OneClickBook app from their app providers and authorize it with a free Adobe ID. PC and Mac users can download Adobe Digital Editions to read on their computers or transfer to an eReader.


Liberty Lake Art Society Exhibit : October—November



BEGINNING OCT 7TH OVERDRIVE TITLES CAN BE RENEWED !


Starting October 7th, library patrons will be able to renew a borrowed WA Anytime or CIN Overdrive title if no other users are on hold for that title.





The Husband's Secret The contents of a letter to be read only after her husband has died (he hasn't) turn out to be more than Cecilia thinks she can handle.

Never Go Back Lee Child's next Jack Reacher title is here, and as exciting as ever.

The Whole Enchilada The latest in Diane Mott's Davidson's Goldy Schulz mystery series is another delicious whodunit.

America's Obsessives: The Compulsive Energy That Built a Nation Joshua Kendall profiles seven single-minded Americans who shaped the course of our history, including Thomas Jefferson, Charles Lindbergh, Steve Jobs, and librarian Melville Dewey.

Lawrence in Arabia: War, Deceit, Imperial Folly and the Making of the Modern Middle East An historical look at the role of Lawrence and three lesser known Westerners in shaping this region toward their own ends in the aftermath of WWI.

Orange is the New Black This memoir looks at the state of women's prisons through the eyes of a well-heeled young lady doing time for the actions of her reckless past. Now a Netflix series.

NEW MOVIES

The Call 911 operator Halle Berry gets a call from an abducted girl. As she rushes to confront the abductor, she finds that she must also confront her past.

Killing Lincoln Based on Bill O'Reilly's best-selling book, this movie for Nat Geo TV covers familiar territory with arguably more historical accuracy than its cohort—or its source material.

Oblivion In a dystopian future, Earth's inhabitants have abandoned the planet for one of Saturn's moons, except for a small crew that maintains a squadron of drones harvesting energy from the oceans and protecting that mission from alien invaders. With Tom Cruise at its helm, it's a mission that predictably twists and turns but is also predictably possible.
