

5. Or choose your own path! Break ground yourself by trying a new genre, a new author, or a topic you've always wanted to explore. You can read anything you like to participate.









ACCESS TO OVER 10,000 MUSIC LABELS FROM 65 COUNTRIES INCLUDING SONY MUSIC'S CATALOG OF LEGENDARY ARTISTS!

Liberty Lake Municipal Library, through its membership in CIN, has joined Library Ideas™ network of Public Library websites that offer access to over 3 million songs including Sony Music's catalog of legendary artists.



The Freegal™ Music Service will allow CIN to increase the size and diversity of its collection by offering access to over 10,000 music labels from 65 different countries.

Under the terms of the agreement, registered resident CIN card holders can download a select number of Freegal Music tracks in the MP3 format each month at no direct cost via the <https://cinlibraries.freegalmusic.com> site. CIN will underwrite the purchase of the music.

In addition, the Freegal Music Service recently announced the availability of free mobile apps for registered resident cardholders of subscribing libraries. The Freegal Music apps are available in the Apple® App Store and Google Play®.

"We have been waiting a long time for a service like this that delivers great music, compatibility with lots of devices and simplicity of use. We think this will be incredibly popular with our patrons and will help the library in marketing all its services to the community," said Pamela Mogen, LLML's Director.

"Membership in CIN has made this possible. Freegal is another of the many benefits of joining with local libraries to increase our ability to offer cutting-edge services."

GARDENING IN THE SHADE: EVA LUSK, WSU MASTER GARDENER



The latest field trip of the Liberty Lake Library Knit & Crochet Group was to Paradise Fibers & Yarns (225 W Indiana Ave, Spokane, WA) on Saturday, May 4. Upon arrival we were greeted by a large selection of yarns on sale right in the parking lot! We were so excited!

The owner, Travis Romin, and one of his staff, Kyle Bickley, made us feel very welcomed as they patiently explained all the processes involved in turning wool into yarn.

We were amazed at the variety of wool and natural fibers available. We learned about hand carding, combing, and blending of fibers. Finally, the most fun was getting to use a spinning wheel to spin the fiber into yarn. The overall ambience of the store was absolutely charming. It is a treasure trove of everything you'd need if you like to knit or crochet.

After the tour, the group enjoyed a lovely lunch at Chairs Café, a local coffee house about a block from Paradise Fibers.
