
10 TIPS AND TRICKS FOR USING OUR NEW CIN CATALOG

1. Use the introductory videos that scroll across the CIN catalog page. Keep in mind that these videos are for a slightly older version than we have now; some features may be slightly different.
2. When searching for items owned by Liberty Lake Municipal Library, be sure to choose Liberty Lake on the drop down box at the top right hand side of the search box.
3. If you know the title, author, or series name you are looking for, be sure to choose that kind of search in the drop down box at the left hand side of the search box.
4. If an item you wish to check out is not available at the moment or only available at another CIN library, you may place a hold on it no matter which library owns it.
5. When placing a hold, always choose "First Available Copy."
6. If your search from the front page box is not producing results, click on "Advanced Search" for ways to make your search more specific.
7. If you are searching for a dvd, music on cd, or an audiobook on cd, always go to "Advanced Search" and click on the media icon to choose that kind of media.
8. If you wish your personal account to keep a record of the items you borrow, go to your account, click on "My Privacy" and follow the steps to enable the program to keep that record for you.
9. We recommend that you place holds on books you know you will want to read as soon as you see them in the catalog. The holds list fills up fast for popular titles, so don't wait!
10. If you expect to be out of town while you have items on a holds list, you may temporarily suspend the holds for the dates you will be gone using the holds calendar to stop and resume delivery.


