

MONTHLY HOLISTIC HEALTH TALKS







We Know It Happens...

Library books get torn, Library DVDs & CDs get scratched, broken, or lost. The policy of the Library's Board of Trustees on these issues is listed on our website in the Policy Handbook.

In summary:

1. Items that are lost, broken, or rendered unusable are charged to the patron at the retail value plus a \$3 processing fee.
2. The Library **cannot accept** a replacement purchased by a patron. As a city department, the library can only accept payment in lieu of a city-owned item.
3. Damaged items, even if the damage is small, must be repaired by library personnel with appropriate tools and supplies. **Please, do not attempt to repair any library item yourself.**
