### Library Tools Help Readers & Listeners Find Books You'll Like




If you are wondering what to read next, NoveList is the place to go! A trusted source for many years, this website provided by Library subscription slices and dices the world of books in ways that make searching for a good read simple, fun and virtually dud-proof.

Of course, you can look up the author of your favorite series, but NoveList will arrange those titles for you in order. Are all those books out? Then use the "Read-Alike" feature that will describe similar titles for you to try. Want to know more about a title? Click on it and get a summary and reviews. Search by title, genre, and even what you may know about the subject.

If you like to read prize-winners, NoveList has a tab for that. Refine your search by writing style, storyline, pace tone, location, audience... So, there's no way you WON'T find something great to read. Next stop will be our online catalog and then a trip down the aisles. Wasn't that easy?

**"But Mom (or Dad), all the Wimpy Kid books are gone!"**

Don't panic, Mom (or Dad). Even if Wimpy Kid is all your



child wants to read, put those titles on hold and then head straight to NoveList K-8 for pages full of Read-Alike titles that will keep Summer Reading going until Wimpy Kid comes back.

Take a tour of NoveList K-8 with your young readers who are hard to please and have fun creating lists of possible books right in your own NoveList account. Print the list or any list the website may suggest and bring it to the library. Or, go to our online catalog and put on hold those books you want and pick them up at the desk later.

For older kids, NoveList K-8 is a great way to explore what else is out there that's like your favorite series or author, or even something totally different! Explore! Discover! Spark a Reaction!


### MONTHLY HOLISTIC HEALTH TALKS

Practicing in the Spokane/Coeur d'Alene area since 2006, both doctors hold degrees in Naturopathic Medicine from Bastyr University.






### Public Hearing on 2015 City Budget July 15th & August 5th





### We Know It Happens...

Library books get torn or wet, Library DVDs & CDs get scratched, broken, or lost. The policy of the Library's Board of Trustees on these issues is listed on our website in the Policy Handbook.

In summary:

1. Items that are lost, broken, or rendered unusable are charged to the patron at the retail value plus a \$3 processing fee.
2. The Library cannot accept a replacement purchased by a patron. As a city department, the library can only accept payment in lieu of a city-owned item.
3. Damaged items, even if the damage is small, must be repaired by library personnel with appropriate tools and supplies. *Please, do not attempt to repair any library item yourself.*
