

## Montana Shakespeare in the Park Returns to Liberty Lake on Saturday, August 23rd @ 5:30



*As You Like It*, this year's Shakespeare in the Park production, will follow in the tradition of some of the company's past performances by transplanting the action, this time from France in the 1500s to the brawling copper town of Butte, Montana in 1917.

Wikipedia describes *As You Like It* as a comedy "which follows its heroine Rosalind as she flees persecution in her uncle's court, accompanied by her cousin Celia to find safety and, eventually, love, in the Forest of Arden. In the forest, they encounter a variety of memorable characters, notably the melancholy traveller Jaques who speaks many of Shakespeare's most famous speeches (such as "All the world's a stage" and "A fool! A fool! I met a fool in the forest")."

The world of the Copper Kings of Butte will substitute for the French court, the forests of the Rockies for Arden, and the turmoil of the mining camps for the intrigue of opposing forces in Renaissance France. Remember to bring a blanket or chair and a picnic dinner!

## New Children's Librarian Melanie Boerner Starts August 5th

Please join us in welcoming our new Children's & YA Librarian Melanie Boerner the next time you are at the library. Melanie comes to us from the San Jose Public Library District in California where she was a branch head of it's Children's department for several years. Responsible for story times that numbered up to ninety kids, YA events, and a huge Summer Reading program with the San Jose Library, Melanie brings a "bag-full" of exciting ideas and energy to Liberty Lake Library. ## Hot Tunes for Hot Days: Freegal Streaming

The Library's music downloading service, Freegal, has made some changes recently that could

really heat up your summer. In March, they



increased the number of downloads of restriction-free MP3 files of over 7 million songs you're allowed from 3 per week to 5. Now, in less than a year and half you could download all 341 Michael Jackson tracks that Freegal gives you access to.


Freegal has also added 15,000 music videos in MP4 format that you can download and keep. Downloading a video is the same as downloading 2 songs, so if you only have one download left you won't be able to get a video. Choose from classic videos like "Uptown Girl" by Billy Joel, "Dancing in the Dark" by Bruce Springsteen, "Games" by New Kids on the Block, as well as the newest hits from Beyoncé, Ke\$ha, and One Direction.

The latest addition to Freegal is their streaming function, which lets you play up to 3 hours of music a day without affecting your downloads or saved music. Choose from dozens of Freegal playlists like Classic Rock, R & B, Kids, Soundtracks, and Pop Top 40, or find your favorite songs and save them to a custom playlist that you can stream any time on your computer. Want to listen on the go? Get the Freegal app available in the iTunes and Google Play app stores to listen through your phone or tablet.



Whether you're at the beach, on the road, or partying in the backyard, Freegal can be the soundtrack to your summer.

## "Liberty Lake—Then and Now" Exhibit @ the Library

### We Know It Happens...

Library books get torn or wet, Library DVDs & CDs get scratched, broken, or lost. The policy of the Library's Board of Trustees on these issues is listed on our website in the Policy Handbook.

In summary:

1. Items that are lost, broken, or rendered unusable are charged to the patron at the retail value plus a \$3 processing fee.
2. The Library **cannot accept** a replacement purchased by a patron. As a city department, the library can only accept payment in lieu of a city-owned item.
3. Damaged items, even if the damage is small, must be repaired by library personnel with appropriate tools and supplies. **Please, do not attempt to repair any library item yourself.**

**Americanah** Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie's acclaimed novel spans the globe in this story of a teenage Nigerian couple separated when they leave their troubled country, and reunited under challenging circumstances.

**The Heist** Daniel Silva returns with another thrilling tale of art restorer/spy Gabriel Allon's adventures.

**Problems with People** A refined collection of stories from the Pacific Northwest's David Guterson (*Snow Falling on Cedars*).

**I Heard My Country Calling** Former senator and Secretary of the Navy James Webb recounts growing up in a family where service to one's country was a strong value and great honor, and how his experience in Vietnam shaped him.

**Sous Chef: 24 Hours on the Line** This fast-paced and engaging memoir joins the realm of food writers like Anthony Bourdain in making a restaurant kitchen come alive.
