

Spokane Is Reading has chosen *Swamplandia!* by Karen Russell as the 2014 community reading event title. The author will hold two talks in the area on October 16. More information can be found at spokaneisreading.org

Swamplandia! is a rich and mystical coming-of-age tale following a family who owns a floundering alligator-wrestling attraction in the Everglades. The family starts to fall apart when mother and star performer Hilola dies, and it is up to wily and resourceful adolescent Ava to enter the heart of darkness to save them all. Boasting vivid description of the Florida wilds, unforgettable characters, and a sincere heart, Russell's novel was a Pulitzer Prize finalist in 2012.

NEW TEEN BOOKS!

Blind by Rachel DeWoskin—14 year old Emma loses her eyesight in a freak accident. Soon after she learns one of her classmates has died. Emma struggles to make sense of both traumatic events.

On the Road to Find Out by Rachel Torr—After being rejected from her college of choice, Alice takes up running instead of continuing her academic lifestyle. She meets new friends along her journey who help her grow as a runner and as a person.

Trouble by Non Pratt—Hannah, a pregnant teen, learns the meaning of friendship—from Aaron, who pretends to be her baby's father.

The Truth About Alice by Jennifer Mathieu—A raw look at the realities of teen life. Told from the perspective of four high school students that think they "know" all about Alice.

When Mr. Dog Bites by Brian Conaghan—Dylan Mint, living with Tourette's, finds out he only has eight months to live. He creates a list of things to do before he dies.

NEW CHILDREN'S BOOKS

Absolutely Almost by Lisa Graff—Albie has a long list of things he's not very good at. Then he meets Calista, his new babysitter. She teaches him how to take pride in himself.

Don't Bump the Glump by Shel Silverstein—Originally published in 1964, this is Silverstein's first collection of poetry.

Finding Truth by Rosemary Groux—This new Christian fantasy novel follows the story of Cassie Pennington, an American teenager who discovers that she is a descendant of Brenwyds, an ancient people who are as much in danger as they are gifted.

The Mark of the Dragonfly by Jaleigh Johnson—13 year old Piper has been working as a scrapper since her father's death. Then, the arrival of a mysterious girl sends her on a dangerous journey to distant lands.

Red Thread Sisters by Carol Peacock—Wen has spent 11 years in an orphanage in China with her best friend, Shu Ling. When she adopted by an American couple she struggles to adjust.







We Know It Happens...

Library books get torn or wet, Library DVDs & CDs get scratched, broken, or lost. The policy of the Library's Board of Trustees on these issues is listed on our website in the Policy Handbook.

In summary:

1. Items that are lost, broken, or rendered unusable are charged to the patron at the retail value plus a \$3 processing fee.
2. The Library cannot accept a replacement purchased by a patron. As a city department, the library can only accept payment in lieu of a city-owned item.
3. Damaged items, even if the damage is small, must be repaired by library personnel with appropriate tools and supplies. *Please, do not attempt to repair any library item yourself.*


