Ebooks / E-audiobooks Easier than Ever!



This free app, created by OverDrive, is available for Android, iOS

(iPhone/iPad/iPod touch), and Windows 10 devices.

1. Install the **Libby** app from your device's app store. Open the app and **find your library**. You can search by library name, city, or zip code.
2. Browse your library's collection and borrow a title. When prompted, sign in. You'll need a valid library card to complete this step. **Use your barcode/ your last name in all caps is your PIN**
3. Borrowed titles appear on your **Shelf** and download to the app automatically so you can read them when you're offline.

From your **Shelf**, you can:

- Tap **Start Reading** or **Start Listening** to open a title.
- Tap the cover image, then **Send to Device** to send a book to Kindle.

Meeting Rooms: How to Reserve One

The Library has a Meeting Room and Learning Center that community groups or individuals can reserve for meetings or presentations by submitting an application or on a first-come-first-served basis. Priority is given to Library programs and meetings.

The Meeting Room can accommodate up to 39 people, the smaller Learning Center up to 12. The Meeting Room is equipped with a media projector, DVD/VHS player, audio system including CD player and PA, white board, refrigerator, microwave, coffee maker, dishwasher, and sink. A laptop computer can be provided for use with prior arrangement. Banquet tables and folding chairs are available. The Learning Center is equipped with computers, 3D printer, a Cri-cutter, scanner, and 55" TV monitor for webinars and video conferencing.

The primary and priority use of the Liberty Lake Municipal Library Meeting Rooms is for conducting official business of the Library and City of Liberty Lake. All meetings held must be open to the public and may not be for the sole purpose of retail of products or services. A Meeting Room is usually only available during Library business hours unless prior approval has been obtained from the Library Director.

To reserve a Meeting Room, a reservation form, available at the library's website, listed under "Services," must be completed, signed and submitted no later than one (1) week prior to the scheduled event. If two (2) reservations are received at the same time, for the same date, the priority ranking will prevail. No first time reservations will be made or accepted by telephone or fax. Applicants must be at least 21 years of age. Proof of age will be required.



Regular volunteer assignments based on current Library needs are available to individuals 14 years and older who submit an application and pass a background check.


Students under 14 years of age fulfilling community service requirements for school will be accepted as volunteers on a case-by-case basis.
