

**ORDINANCE NO. 86
CITY OF LIBERTY LAKE
SPOKANE COUNTY, WASHINGTON**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY LAKE, WASHINGTON REQUIRING
THE CONNECTION OF DEVELOPED PROPERTIES TO THE PUBLIC SEWER
SYSTEM.**

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and declares it is in the best interest of the City of Liberty Lake to require all premises including residential and business uses to connect to the available public sewer system in order to promote and protect the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens;

WHEREAS, the City acknowledges that there are existing on-site septic systems which will be allowed to exist provided there is not a failure of the system which would necessitate a connection to the public sewer system; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of Spokane County and the Spokane County Health District to discourage on-site sewage disposal when public sewer service is available for residential premises and significant industrial users or when the public health, safety and welfare would be adversely affected.


NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Liberty Lake, Washington, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Sanitary Sewer Connections. Unless otherwise prohibited by law, all persons desiring to dispose of sanitary sewage, industrial waste water or other similar liquid waste may only discharge the same into an available public sewer. The City adopts the definitions of "public sewer" and "sanitary sewage" as set forth in the Spokane County Code at Sections 8.03.1750 and 8.03.1770, respectively. Existing on-site systems shall be allowed to exist until public sewer is available. A public sewer is deemed to be "available" according to Spokane County Code 8.03.3040.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after publication of this Ordinance or a summary thereof in the official newspaper of the City as provided by law.



**NOTICE OF ORDINANCE PASSED

SYSTEM.**


The introductory paragraphs state the City desires to require that sanitary waste be disposed of through the public sewer.

Section 1 requires the disposal of sanitary waste through the public sewer.

Section 2 establishes a severability clause in the event some portion of the Ordinance is held invalid.

Section 3 states this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after publication of the Ordinance Summary.
