# HOW TO USE THE DASHBOARD

The Results Dashboard is designed to demonstrate return on the city’s investment in programs that deliver core services to residents, businesses, and guests. The dashboard helps connect the city’s Priority Based Budget with key results identified in the 2024-2028 Strategic Plan through key metrics.

The information is arranged in the following way:

**Program** – a set of related activities, services, or projects intended to produce a desired result. The city currently manages 66 programs (53 operating, 13 capital). The investment in each program is measured by the number of dollars allocated to it through the budget, which is provided in each section header.

**Expected Result** – the expected outcome (or return on investment) from each program, which is demonstrated by certain key metrics. Each program will have at least 1 expected result (no more than 3).

**Metric** – the measurement used to quantify an expected result and indicate the value of return on investment. Each expected result will have at least 1 metric (no more than 4).
































